Try making your own symmetrical shapes by folding a piece of paper in half and cutting out some shapes. 	Identify: Ask your friends and family what pets they have at home. Count how many each animal there is. You could create a tally chart or pictogram to represent how many of each animal there is. Which is the most popular pet?	Create: Owls and birds love to live in forests and woodlands but they also like to visit gardens, towns and cities. Can you make a bird feeder for all the birds that may visit your garden or window? Simply thread hooped cereals onto a pipe clear or string for a tasty snack!
