Amazing Hotels – Descriptions

The Manta Resort - Tanzania

This resort on the tropical island of Pemba offers its guests an underwater hotel. This is a floating three-storey lodge with the bedroom surrounded by windows, completely underneath the sea. You will fall asleep surrounded by coral, colourful fish and dolphins.

Kakslutten Arctic Resort – Finland

In this hotel, you sleep in an igloo cabin. The igloos are not made of ice, but they have transparent domed ceilings so that you can see the outside world at all times. You may see the northern lights or even spot reindeer roaming free through the woods that surround you.

Hard Day's Night Hotel, Liverpool

This hotel is dedicated to the Liverpool band, the Beatles. It is the world's only Beatle's inspired hotel. You can stay in the John Lennon or Paul McCartney Suite. The Lennon Suite has an all-white décor and includes a piano, lounge area, and a private bathroom suite.

Montana Magica Lodge, Chile

This hotel recreates the shape of a mountain. It is set in the Huilo Huilo reserve in Chile and is surrounded by natural springs. There are also many different types of plant and animal to see. The rooms are log cabins and the windows look out onto the surrounding mountains.
