

Juniper Newsletter SpringTerm 2022




Welcome back! We hope you have enjoyed the Christmas break. We have some fantastic learning opportunities this term that we look forward to sharing with you!

Learning This Term:

Our **history** this term is all about the era of Viking Britain: where they came from; the impact of their invasion on the United Kingdom; their beliefs and stories; and what day-to-day life was like at the time. In **geography**, we will learn about the region of Scandinavia, including exploring major cities and comparing human and physical features. We will also learn about the geography of rivers.

We will continue to develop our **reading** and **writing** skills this term and will be producing narratives, journalistic writing, information texts and poetry. In **mathematics**, we will mostly be focusing on fractions as well as their connection to decimals and percentages.

In art, we will explore Viking patterns and also improve our drawing and sketching skills by creating pictures of warriors and dragon heads. We will also be baking bread as a **D&T** project, later in the term. Our **science** focus will be on 'forces' and 'Earth & space'.



Class Books:

The children will be using the texts *Viking Boy by Tony Bradman* t and **Sky Song by Abi Elphinstone** to stimulate their imagination and reading skills and inspire writing for a variety of purposes. We will also explore a range of **Norse Myths**, as well as **folk tales**.
