# Home Learning

# General Reminders

- PE: Our main PE lessons will be on Monday We try to do as many lessons outside as possible so it is important that the children have both inside and outside PE kits including suitable footwear and warm clothing. Please ensure that children with long hair have it tied back and earrings are removed. We would suggest you leave their kit at school so it is always available.
- Uniform: Can you please make sure uniform & PE kits are clearly labelled to avoid confusion when children misplace some of their belongings.
- Coats: As the weather is changeable and we like to use our outdoor learning environment, please ensure that your child has a suitable coat with them regardless of the weather conditions.
- Water bottles: The children should bring in a water bottle from home with a sports style cap, which they can access throughout the day. They will be encouraged to change their water regularly and take them home each evening to be washed. Please make sure your child's name is written clearly on their water bottle.
- Rucksacks: Your child should only need to bring their packed lunch, a water bottle and their reading book if
  they wish to change it. PE kits can be stored at school throughout the term. As children should not be bringing
  non-essential items in from home, rucksacks should not be brought into school, especially as there is limited
  storage space in the classroom.
