
Our learning this term

Our final history topic of the year is all about World War 2. This is a fascinating period in British history, where we will find out more about: the causes, the allied countries, as well as the effects of rationing, evacuation and The Blitz. Our geography learning will also look at the relationships between countries and how these relationships change over time. One of the class texts that we will look at is Goodnight Mr Tom, which tells the fictional story of an evacuee in the war. Though we will look at many other texts as well.

We have some very exciting learning opportunities planned throughout the curriculum, including:

- making art installations
- building Anderson shelters
- using stop-motion animation
- looping and remixing music... and much more!
