English

Reading books shall continue to be changed, hopefully on Mondays or Tuesday. Please ensure your child has their book and reading log in their bag. Children will be writing words and sentences linked to books they read during the Phonics and Literacy lesson.

<u>Maths</u>

Children will focus on; Comparing Numbers, Money, Time and Measure. Maths continues to be a combination of practical and written work.

<u>Topic</u>

Our new topic for this half term will be 'Animal Crackers' where we will be focusing on various animals, ways to care for animals and creative work. There will also be a talk from veterinary nurse about how they look after animals on Tuesday 30^{th} April.
