

Road safety 4th October 2017 Pupil Voice

We had a really good meeting with the Road Safety Committee Group which includes staff, Parish Councillors and pupils.

We shared numerous ideas about ways to reduce congestion and ensure families choose to walk, bike or scoot to school!

Our monthly 'Sticker days' were really successful for the last two years but we want to try and develop something new.

At the start of every month we will have record in class which pupils have walked, biked or used their scooter to get to school. The winning class will receive a reward each month. Over the year or perhaps each term, the reward certificates will be handed out to pupils too.

We will also have regular assemblies and SMSC lessons about the importance of choosing to walk to school. Some pupils are unable to do this though as they live outside of the area – however we will praise those who 'park and stride.'

PCSO Marc Ireland is coming into school this week to remind us how important it is to wear a helmet. Parents have now been asked to sign consent slips to allow pupils to ride a bike etc to ensure all pupils are safe.

We will be designing posters to encourage people not to park in Cooper Lane if they do drive. We could have an art competition and whoever has the best design will have their poster displayed around the village.

This week the Road Safety Committee will be walking round Laceby and timing how long it takes to walk from various car parking points. We will add this information into a newsletter to share with parents and pupils as this may encourage even more pupils to walk to school as it doesn't take long!

Finally, Mr Cullam from the NEL Road Safety team will be leading workshops during Road Safety Week (20th November 2017) for pupils at school.
