FAQ's on Academy conversion

What are the main differences between a Local Authority School and an Academy?

Academies are responsible and accountable to a Trust Board. Trusts tend to be smaller than Local Authorities meaning they have a closer relationship with their schools.

This closer relationship should mean that Trusts are able to support their schools better and with speedier intervention where necessary.

Will there be changes to school term times, length of day and after school facilities?

Wellspring does not have a 'one size fits all' approach. Local context will determine decisions that the leadership make about these matters. The Trust maintains the same holidays as other schools in the locality. School leaders are empowered to make decisions for their school and community.
